THE SCOPE OF *CHINESE SCIENCE*

Chinese Science is published by the International Society for the History of East Asian Science, Technology, and Medicine. Numbers 1–10 (1975-92) were published irregularly. Beginning with Number 11 (1993-94), *Chinese Science* has been published annually at the University of California, Los Angeles, sponsored by the International Studies and Overseas Programs office and the Centers for Chinese Studies (Editorial Office) and Pacific Rim Studies (Production Office).

This journal includes studies of science, technology, and medicine in early and contemporary East Asia. Any study based on research in Chinese primary sources or artifacts (or Korean or Japanese sources or artifacts if the theme is not exclusively Korean or Japanese), that throws light on the work of scientists, physicians, and technologists in the Chinese tradition will gladly be considered.

SUBMISSIONS

Potential contributors are encouraged to correspond with the editor before submitting manuscripts in order to ensure that their work falls within the purview of *Chinese Science* and to simplify the preparation of final copy. All contributions except invited reviews are refereed. The editor does not referee. Both Pinyin and Wade-Giles transcriptions are accepted. Guidelines on the preparation of manuscripts and on submission of manuscripts in the form of computer files are available on request.
