The Rosalyn Higgins Prize

In light of her outstanding and inspiring achievements in the field of international dispute settlement, the Publisher of *The Law & Practice of International Courts and Tribunals* (LPICT) has established a **Prize in honour of H.E. Rosalyn Higgins**. The Prize is awarded annually to the author of the best submission dealing with the law and practice of the International Court of Justice, either solely focusing on the ICJ or with the ICJ as one of the dispute settlement mechanisms under consideration.

The choice of the **2023 prize-winning** article was made by an expert jury, including Prof. Freya Baetens (co-Editor-in-Chief), Prof. Régis Bismuth (co-Editor-in-Chief), Prof. Mathias Forteau, Ms Valérie Hugues and Judge Georg Nolte (ICJ). The Publisher expresses its gratitude to all of them for their contributions.

From an impressive shortlist of articles, the jury has chosen **Mr Nikiforos Panagis** as the recipient of the 2023 Rosalyn Higgins Prize for his article '*Exploring the Limits of the Jurisdiction to Assess Compliance with Provisional Measures*'.
