The editors

Heribert Hallermann is Professor emeritus of ecclesiastical law at the Julius Maximilian University of Würzburg. Professor Hallermann's research focuses on the constitutional law of the Latin Church, on the common rights and duties of the faithful, the ecclesiastical law of associations and religious orders, and the ecclesiastical university law.

Thomas Meckel is Professor of ecclesiastical law, religious law and church legal history at the Philosophisch-Theologischen Hochschule Sankt Georgen Frankfurt. Professor Meckel's research focuses on the theological foundations of ecclesiastical law/theology of law, constitutional law, the right of promulgation and sacramental law, state ecclesiastical law/religious law as well as the history of ecclesiastical law.

Michael Droege is Professor of public law, administrative law, religious constitutional law and ecclesiastical law at the Eberhard Karls University of Tübingen. Professor Droege's current research projects focus on the financing and assets of religious communities, e.g. current issues of ecclesiastical tax law or the transparency of ecclesiastical property law.

Heinrich de Wall is Professor of ecclesiastical, constitutional and administrative law at the Friedrich-Alexander-University Erlangen-Nuremberg. Professor de Wall's research focuses on state ecclesiastical law, Protestant ecclesiastical law, the history of state theory and general administrative law.

Die A. wird nicht nur vom staatl. Recht u. als gemeinsame Angelegenheit von Staat u. Religion religionsrechtlich, sondern auch kirchenrechtlich geregelt. Die A. bezieht sich auf die Militärseelsorge, die Seelsorge in Justizvollzugsanstalten bzw. Gefängnissen, die Seelsorge in Einrichtungen für den Strafvollzug von Jugendlichen, die Seelsorge in Krankenhäusern u. a. Anstalten wie Alters- od. Pflegeheimen, die Seelsorge bei der Landes- od. Bundespolizei eingeschlossen die Seelsorge in Polizeibildungsstätten od. sonstigen öff. Anstalten wie Behindertenheimen od. kommunalen Friedhöfen.

Die A. ist auch Gegenstand des kath. KR. So gehört die Sorge um die Kranken u. die Gefangenen seit den Anfängen der Kirche zu ihren zentralen Handlungsfeldern. Eine Anstalt umfasst Personen, die aufgrund versch. Umstände sich in dieser befinden. C. 568 macht den Grund der Kategorie Seelsorge deutlich, der m. dem Grund der religionsrechtlichen Bestimmungen korreliert. Es geht um Gläubige, „... die wegen ihrer Lebensumstände nicht der ordentlichen Seelsorge der Pfarrer teilhaftig sein können“.

Die A. dient dazu, das Grundrecht aller Gläubigen auf die kirchl. Heilsgüter, insb. auf Verkündigung u. die Sakramente, gem. c. 213 zu erfüllen. Der CIC/1983 operiert nicht m. dem Begriff der A. bzw. der Kategorie Seelsorge, weist aber der Sache nach entspr. Normen zur A. auf. Im Pfarrenrecht finden sich mit den cc. 564-572 Normen über die Kpl. (cappellani) u. somit einschlägige Bestimmungen für die Hirtensorge für bes. Gemeinschaften.
