



### *Instructions for Authors*

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## Scope

*Brill's Journal of Afroasiatic Languages and Linguistics (AALL)* is a peer-reviewed international forum devoted to the descriptive and theoretical study of Afroasiatic languages. The territory of the Afroasiatic family spans a vast area to the South of the Mediterranean, extending from the Atlantic Ocean to the Middle East and reaching deep into the heart of Africa. Some of the Afroasiatic languages have been studied for centuries, while others still remain partially or entirely undocumented.

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## Submission

Submissions to the journal should be sent electronically as an e-mail attachment (in PDF, Word or RTF format) to the Series Contact Editor:

### *Double-blinded Peer Review*

All submitted papers will be subject to double-blinded peer review. For reviewing purposes, the draft paper should be anonymous. No author details should be identifiable from the article itself or in the acknowledgements. The author(s) details should be submitted in a separate file and include the author's name, affiliation, full postal and email addresses, the abstract, keywords, and any acknowledgement texts..

## Submission Requirements

### *Language*

Articles and book reviews should be written in English. Spelling (British or American) should be consistent throughout.



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#### *Transliteration and Orthography*

All linguistic data must be transliterated.

#### *Unicode and Non-Roman Fonts*

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The journal reserves the right to copy-edit contributions to conform to its style.

Manuscript pages should be numbered consecutively, double-spaced with wide margins on all sides (use ragged rather than justified right margins). Use as little formatting as possible; do not use desktop publishing features such as justification, centering, or bold-face type. Do not hyphenate words at the end of a line. TAB should be restricted to a paragraph indent.

#### *Abstracts*

Articles should include a short abstract (150 words).

#### *Keywords*

Please supply 2-6 keywords (in lowercase letters), to be placed below the abstract, for indexing purposes.

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Italics may be indicated by either underlining or using *italics*.

#### *Figures*

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All figures must be cited consecutively in the text. Figures should be submitted as separate source files in .eps, .tif, or .jpg format, in a size suitable for the typesetting area of the journal. The resolution of these files should be at least 300 dpi for half-tone figures, and 600 dpi for line drawings. Number the files, and indicate in the manuscript where they are to go. If there is a question as to where the top of the illustration is, please indicate this in the figure file. Graphs created in Word or Excel **must** be submitted in pdf format (or .eps, .jpeg or .tif). The same resolution requirements apply (see above).

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
