



Instructions for Authors

Scope

Brill's Journal of Afroasiatic Languages and Linguistics (AALL) is a peer-reviewed international forum devoted to the descriptive and theoretical study of Afroasiatic languages. The territory of the Afroasiatic family spans a vast area to the South of the Mediterranean, extending from the Atlantic Ocean to the Middle East and reaching deep into the heart of Africa. Some of the Afroasiatic languages have been studied for centuries, while others still remain partially or entirely undocumented.

Ethical and Legal Conditions

The publication of a manuscript in a peer-reviewed work is expected to follow standards of ethical behavior for all parties involved in the act of publishing: authors, editors, and reviewers. Double-blinded Peer Review

All submitted papers will be subject to double-blinded peer review. For reviewing purposes, the draft paper should be anonymous. No author details should be identifiable from the article itself or in the acknowledgements. The author(s) details should be submitted in a separate file and include the author's name, affiliation, full postal and email addresses, the abstract, keywords, and any acknowledgement texts..

Submission Requirements

Language

Articles and book reviews should be written in English. Spelling (British or American) should be consistent throughout.



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Transliteration and Orthography

All linguistic data must be transliterated.

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Manuscript Structure

General Information

Papers that are submitted for initial consideration should be complete, including all glosses, notes, bibliographical references, tables, etc. The final draft of a manuscript accepted for publication must be submitted electronically. Electronic files should be saved in pdf and word format. Final versions and printouts must be proofread carefully before submission; please use your spelling and grammar check. Non-native speakers are strongly advised to have their work read by a native speaker.

The journal reserves the right to copy-edit contributions to conform to its style.

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Manuscript pages should be numbered consecutively, double-spaced with wide margins on all sides (use ragged rather than justified right margins). Use as little formatting as possible; do not use desktop publishing features such as justification, centering, or bold-face type. Do not hyphenate words at the end of a line. TAB should be restricted to a paragraph indent.

Abstracts

Articles should include a short abstract (150 words).

Keywords

Please supply 2-6 keywords (in lowercase letters), to be placed below the abstract, for indexing purposes.

Glosses

The journal uses Leipzig Glossing Rules. Please format glosses in a table in Word. This will help the typesetter to convert the glosses without mistakes into the final lay-out. Please see further guidelines at:
