## Scope

Counseling and Values (CVJ) is the official journal of the <u>Association for Spiritual, Ethical, and Religious Values in Counseling</u> (ASERVIC), formerly the Association for Religious and Values Issues in Counseling (ARVIC), a division of the <u>American Counseling Association</u>. Counseling and Values promotes theory, research, and practice on the intersection of religion, spirituality, and ethics in the counseling process, with a particular emphasis on the competent and ethical integration of religion and spirituality into counseling. The journal publishes and seeks articles on:

- Research and Theory Quantitative, qualitative, mixed method, and single case design
  manuscripts that provide empirical data related to ethical, religious, or spiritual issues in
  counseling.
- Issues and Insights Manuscripts that offer fresh information on philosophical, theoretical, and
  practical applications of ethical, religious, or spiritual issues in counseling.
- Techniques for Spiritual, Ethical, and Religious Counseling (TSERC) Manuscripts that focus
  on practical issues related to (a) the development or adaptation of existing techniques for
  working with spiritual, ethical, and/or religious values in counseling and/or (b) experience
  related to the effectiveness of techniques in work with clients and client systems.

# **Ethical and Legal Conditions**

The publication of a manuscript in a peer-reviewed work is expected to follow standards of ethical behavior for all parties involved in the act of publishing: authors, editors, and reviewers. Authors, editors, and reviewers should thoroughly acquaint themselves with Brill's publication ethics, which may be downloaded here: <a href="mailto:brill.com/page/ethics/publication-ethics-cope-compliance">brill.com/page/ethics/publication-ethics-cope-compliance</a>.

### Online Submission

*CVJ* now uses online submission only. Authors should submit their manuscript online via the Editorial Manager (EM) online submission system at: <a href="editorialmanager.com/cvj">editorialmanager.com/cvj</a>. First-time users of EM need to register first. Go to the website and click on the "Register Now' link in the login menu. Enter the information requested. During registration, you can fill in your username and password. If you should forget your Username and Password, click on the "send login details" link in the login section, and enter your e-mail address exactly as you entered it when you registered. Your access codes will then be e-mailed to you.

Prior to submission, authors are strongly encouraged to read the 'Instructions for Authors'. When

submitting via the website, you will be guided stepwise through the creation and uploading of the various files. A revised document is uploaded the same way as the initial submission. The system automatically generates an electronic (PDF) proof, which is then used for reviewing purposes. All correspondence, including the editor's request for revision and final decision, is sent by e-mail.

#### Double-blinded Peer Review

CVJ uses a double-blind peer review system, which means that manuscript author(s) do not know who the reviewers are, and that reviewers do not know the names of the author(s). When you submit your article via Editorial Manager, you will be asked to submit a separate title page that includes: the full title of the manuscript, the names and complete contact details of all authors, the abstract, keywords, and any acknowledgement texts. For revised manuscripts, authors also need to upload a response to reviewers file. These pages will not be accessible to the referees. All other files (manuscript, figures, tables, etc.) should not contain any information concerning author names, institutions, etc. The names of these files and the document properties should also be anonymized.

### File Format

Authors should make use of Apple Macintosh or PC format and Unicode fonts, (esp. Gentium) or the Brill font. Word and Mellel are preferred word processors. The files should be submitted in both doc(x) and PDF formats.

# **Submission Requirements**

#### Language

CVJ uses American or British English (other variants of English are also accepted as long as there is consistency in its use). Simple sentence structures and clear expression are encouraged for the benefit of all readers, especially those for whom English is a second language.

## Instructions for Authors

### Length

Articles should normally be between around 11,400 words (30 pages). This includes references, footnotes, tables, figures, acknowledgments, etc.

## **Manuscript Structure**

The manuscript should be typed in 12 pt, Times New Roman, double spaced, with 10 pt Times New Roman single spaced for footnotes.

Submissions should contain the following elements in this order:

- 1. Title page. Containing name(s) and order of the authors, institutional affiliations, e-mail address, ORCID iD, and postal address.
- 2. Abstract. The abstract should provide a summary of the key points not exceeding 150 words.
- 3. Keywords. Up to 6 key words should be provided for the benefit of indexing and abstracting services.
- 4. The main text (see style guidelines below)
- 5. Acknowledgements (if applicable). Contributors, collaborators, publication contexts, etc.
- 6. References. Bibliography, Film/Videography, other.

#### Headings and Subheadings

Headings should preferably be used at least every 7.000 characters or 1.000 words. Titles and subtitles must be clearly distinguished by their typography. *CVJ* uses two levels of headings.

#### **Abstract**

The contribution should start with a short abstract of no more than 150 words in one paragraph.

#### **Keywords**

Up to 5 keywords should be listed, separated by a semi-colon (;).

#### *Footnotes*

Please use footnotes only if necessary; they should not be used instead of in-text citations. Notes should appear at the bottom of the page, with the numerical sequence running throughout the article. These should be kept to a minimum and identified by a superscript number.

## References

### Citations in Body Text

CVJ uses in-text citations: Author (2007); (Author, 2007); Author and Authors (2004); (Author & Authors, 2004); Bradley et al. (1999); (Bradley et al., 1999).

Details of all of the works cited should appear at the end of the paper in the "References."

### **Figures**

Photographs and illustrations are very welcome. A minimum of 300 dpi resolution is required for photographs and illustrations. TIFF or JPEG files are preferred.

Line drawings and other diagrams should be in a camera-ready state, capable of reduction and a minimum of 600 dpi resolution is required.

All photographs and illustrations should be accompanied by a caption, which should include the figure number, and appear in sequence, with an acknowledgement to the holder of the copyright, where necessary.

### **Quotations**

Within paragraphs, quotations should be used sparingly and identified by single quotation marks . Paragraph quotations (longer than 40 words) must be indented with an additional one-line space above and below, without quotation marks.

#### **Publication**

### **Proofs**

Upon acceptance, a PDF of the article proofs will be sent to authors by e-mail to check carefully for factual and typographic errors. Authors are responsible for checking these proofs and are urged to make use of the Comment & Markup toolbar to note their corrections directly on the proofs. At this stage in the production process only minor corrections are allowed. Alterations to the original manuscript at this stage will result in considerable delay in publication and, therefore, are not accepted unless charged to the author. Proofs should be returned promptly. Revised proofs of articles are read by the authors and Editors; revised proofs are sent to authors of reviews where necessary.

# E-Offprints

A PDF file of the article will be supplied free of charge by the publisher to authors for personal use. Brill is a RoMEO yellow publisher. The Author retains the right to self-archive the submitted (pre-peer-

review) version of the article at any time. The submitted version of an article is the author's version that has not been peer-reviewed, nor had any value added to it by Brill (such as formatting or copy editing). The Author retains the right to self-archive the accepted (peer-reviewed) version without any embargo period. The accepted version means the version which has been accepted for publication and contains all revisions made after peer reviewing and copy editing, but has not yet been typeset in the publisher's lay-out. The publisher's lay-out must not be used in any repository or on any website (brill.com/resources/authors/publishing-books-brill/self-archiving-rights).

### License to Publish

## Transfer of Copyright

By submitting a manuscript, the author agrees that the copyright for the article is transferred to the publisher if and when the article is accepted for publication. For that purpose the author needs to sign the **License to Publish** which will be sent with the first proofs of the manuscript.

#### Open Access

Should the author wish to publish the article in Open Access he/she can choose the Brill Open option. This allows for non-exclusive Open Access publication under a Creative Commons license in exchange for an Article Publication Charge (APC), upon signing a special Brill Open Consent to Publish Form.
