



Scope

Counseling and Values (CVJ) is the official journal of the Association for Spiritual, Ethical, and Religious Values in Counseling (ASERVIC), formerly the Association for Religious and Values Issues in Counseling (ARVIC), a division of the American Counseling Association. *Counseling and Values* promotes theory, research, and practice on the intersection of religion, spirituality, and ethics in the counseling process, with a particular emphasis on the competent and ethical integration of religion and spirituality into counseling. The journal publishes and seeks articles on:

- **Research and Theory** – Quantitative, qualitative, mixed method, and single case design manuscripts that provide empirical data related to ethical, religious, or spiritual issues in counseling.
- **Issues and Insights** – Manuscripts that offer fresh information on philosophical, theoretical, and practical applications of ethical, religious, or spiritual issues in counseling.
- **Techniques for Spiritual, Ethical, and Religious Counseling (TSERC)** – Manuscripts that focus on practical issues related to (a) the development or adaptation of existing techniques for working with spiritual, ethical, and/or religious values in counseling and/or (b) experience related to the effectiveness of techniques in work with clients and client systems.

Submission Requirements

Language

CVJ uses American or British English (other variants of English are also accepted as long as there is consistency in its use). Simple sentence structures and clear expression are encouraged for the benefit of all readers, especially those for whom English is a second language.



Instructions for Authors

Length

Articles should normally be between around 11,400 words (30 pages). This includes references, footnotes, tables, figures, acknowledgments, etc.

Manuscript Structure

The manuscript should be typed in 12 pt, Times New Roman, double spaced, with 10 pt Times New Roman single spaced for footnotes.

Submissions should contain the following elements in this order:

1. Title page. Containing name(s) and order of the authors, institutional affiliations, e-mail address, ORCID iD, and postal address.
2. Abstract. The abstract should provide a summary of the key points not exceeding 150 words.
3. Keywords. Up to 6 key words should be provided for the benefit of indexing and abstracting services.
4. The main text (see style guidelines below)
5. Acknowledgements (if applicable). Contributors, collaborators, publication contexts, etc.
6. References. Bibliography, Film/Videography, other.

Headings and Subheadings

Headings should preferably be used at least every 7,000 characters or 1,000 words. Titles and subtitles must be clearly distinguished by their typography. *CVJ* uses two levels of headings.

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The contribution should start with a short abstract of no more than 150 words in one paragraph.

Keywords

Up to 5 keywords should be listed, separated by a semi-colon (;).



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References

Citations in Body Text

CVJ uses in-text citations: Author (2007); (Author, 2007); Author and Authors (2004); (Author & Authors, 2004); Bradley et al. (1999); (Bradley et al., 1999).

Details of all of the works cited should appear at the end of the paper in the "References."

Bibliographical references come at the end of the paper; some basic examples are given below.
