Scope

The *Journal of Femininities* is the first academic journal devoted to the study of Femininities and uniquely offers an outlet for scholarship on femininity. The *Journal of Femininities* cultivates and unifies the field of Femininities by publishing content that advances theories and methods in the study of femininity. The journal seeks to challenge and re-examine the taken-for-granted norms and associations of femininity and to treat Femininities as an academic discipline similar to others that focus on particular social dimensions. Submission Requirements

Language

The journal publishes articles in English. Contributions should be grammatically correct and in good literary style. All spelling should be consistent. Authors are free to use either American English or British English, but usage must be consistent throughout a submission.

Font

Ordinary Roman style text Arial and Times New Roman that come with Microsoft Windows are fine.

Unicode and Non-Roman Fonts

For extended characters, authors should ensure that they use a Unicode-friendly font such as the Brill (brill.com/about/brill-fonts).

Updated versions of Times New Roman in Microsoft Windows contain Greek and Hebrew Unicode fonts.

The Society of Biblical Literature has produced Hebrew and Greek Unicode fonts. The Hebrew comes with keyboard driver. They are available at sbl-site.org/educational/biblicalfonts.aspx.

Types and Length of Submissions

The journal will welcome the following types of submissions (in *APA* format). For all empirical research, the Editors-in-Chief encourage uploading a supplementary file with a more detailed methods section. Length limits for articles do not include footnotes and reference lists.

- Brief reports (2,000 words)
- Original research (7,500 words)
- Systematic and scoping reviews (10,000 words)
- Critical essays (6,000 words)

- Clinical notes (6,000 words)
- Legal notes (6,000 words)

- Policy reports (6,000 words)

- Book reviews (2,000 words)
- Interviews and roundtables (4,000 words)

Manuscript Structure

Abstract and Keywords

All manuscripts should be accompanied by an abstract in English of no more than 150 words and a list of no more than six or seven keywords. Given the interdisciplinary focus of the journal, in order to help readers locate the contribution of the manuscript, authors are encouraged to identify explicitly in the abstract and/or keywords the primary discipline(s) to which they are contributing.

References

Footnotes may be used for supplemental information, but references should be given as in-text citations following *APA* style, with a list of references (labeled “References”) at the end of the article. A References



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list is required for all contributions. For guidance on in-text citation according to *APA* style, you may consult any number of resources on the internet or at your institution.

For the References section:

- Do not use dashes for repeated author names.
- Capitalization of titles in both headline-style or sentence-style is allowed. Please follow the same capitalization style as in the original title.
- Reverse italics in titles are permitted when applicable.
- The Reference List should be presented in roman script. Use a transcribed version of the reference where necessary. The original script can be included within square brackets.
- For types of references not listed below, you may consult any guide to the use of *APA* style.
