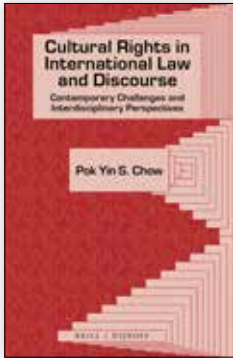
## Children's Rights: New Issues, New Themes, New Perspectives

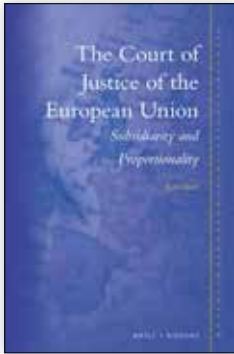
## Incitement to Terrorism
