Scope

The peer-reviewed journal *Indo-European Linguistics* (IEUL) is devoted to the study of the ancient and medieval Indo-European languages from the perspective of modern theoretical linguistics. It provides a venue for synchronic and diachronic linguistic studies of the Indo-European languages and the Indo-European family as a whole within any theoretically informed or analytical framework. It also welcomes typological investigations, especially those which make use of crosslinguistic data, including that from non-Indo-European languages, as well as research which draws upon the findings of language acquisition, cognitive science, variationist sociolinguistics, and language contact.

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Manuscript Structure

General

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Authors should not use desktop publishing features such as justification, centering, or boldface type. Italics should be indicated by using proper italics. Do not hyphenate words at the end of a line. TAB should be restricted to a paragraph indent.

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
