*Rilka Dragneva* is a member of the Institute of East European Law and Russian Studies, Faculty of Law, Leiden University. At present, she is engaged in a post-doctoral research project on the process of legal harmonization within the CIS, and teaches on International Commercial Contracts and Corporate Governance with Leiden's International Business Law LL.M. Program. Rilka Dragneva graduated in law from the University of Sofia, Bulgaria, and holds a Masters' and Doctorate degree from the University of Sussex, UK.

*Ferdinand Feldbrugge* is Professor Emeritus for East European Law at Leiden University. From 1973 to 1998, he was the director of the Institute of East European Law and Russian Studies and editor of the *Law in Eastern Europe* series, and the *Review of Central and East European Law*. He served as Special Advisor Soviet and East European Affairs ("Sovietologist-in-Residence") to the Secretary-General of NATO from 1987 to 1989 and as President of the International Council for Central and East European Studies from 1995 to 2000.

*Svetlana A. Gorchkova* obtained a Ph.D. in Public International Law from the Institute of State and Law (Moscow) of the Russian Academy of Sciences in 1998. She also holds a Master's Degree from University Robert Schuman, Strasbourg III. From 1998 to 2000, Dr. Gorchkova was associated with the Registry of the European Court of Human Rights, and in 2002 with the Secretariat of the Council of Europe. Her areas of research have most recently included the integration of Russia into the European legal space and the application of international conventions by the European Court of Human Rights. She is the author of a monograph entitled *Standarty Soveta Evropy po pravam cheloveka i rossiiskoe zakonodatel'stvo* (Standards of the Council of Europe in Human Rights and Russian Legislation), Moscow 2001, and more than thirty articles that have been published in a number of Russian legal journals including *Gosudarstvo i pravo* (State and Law), *Zhurnal rossiiskogo prava* (Journal of Russian Law), and *Moskovskii zhurnal mezhdunarodnogo prava* (Moscow Journal of International Law). In 2000, she was awarded the Hugo Grotius Prize (at a ceremony in The Royal Netherlands Embassy in Moscow) as one of the outstanding young legal scholars in international law the Russian Federation.
