Nedim Ademović is Registrar of the Human Rights Commission within the Constitutional Court of Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH). He has been a legal advisor to the Constitutional Court of BiH and a staff attorney with the World University Service (Austria). Mr. Ademović studied at the School of Law, University of Sarajevo (1991-1994) and holds a Master's degree in law (1999) from Karl-Franzens-Universität Graz, (Austria). In 2004, he passed the bar exam in Sarajevo and also obtained his PhD in law Karl-Franzens-Universität. His dissertation was devoted to: "Art. 14 des EGV: Vier Freiheiten im Kontext von Bosnien und Herzegowina".

His has also attended programs such as "Region and Minorities in a Greater Europe" (European Academy Bozen/Bolzano, Italy) and "Human Rights Law and Practice Programme" (Institute for European Law, University of Birmingham, UK).

Mr. Wąsiewski has had several internships in both law firms and central administrative bodies, including the Office of the President of the Republic of Poland.

Mr. Wąsiewski's research interests encompass constitutional law, international public law, European law and legal theory. He focuses mainly on issues of European constitutionalism, as well as on constitutional jurisdiction.

Currently, he is working towards a PhD degree at the Nicolaus Copernicus University Faculty Law (Department of Constitutional Law). Mr. Wąsiewski is also an associate at White & Case (Warsaw) where he has been involved in matters dealing with energy regulation, mergers and acquisitions, and with constitutional and European law.

Vladimir V. Yarkov is Professor of Law and Chairperson of the Department of Civil Procedure at the Ural State Law Academy, Ekaterinburg, Russia. He is editor-in-chief of *Rossiiskii ezhegodnik grazhdanskogo protsesssa i arbitrazha* and of the journal *Arbitrazhnyi i Grazhdanskii protsess*, a member of the Advisory Committees to the Supreme Arbitration Court of the Russian Federation and the Russian Constitutional Court, and a member of the International Association of Procedural Law and the Association of International Civil Procedure.

Since 1998, Professor Yarkov has also been a visiting professor at the University of Paris X. He is the author of more than 400 publications—books, textbooks and articles on civil procedure and arbitration, enforcement of judgments, notarial law, and international civil procedure.
