(This, the final volume of an invaluable reference-book, deals with foreign sources, and sources for provincial and local history. The Additions and Corrections to the preceding volumes run to 67 pp., and there is a full alphabetical index to the whole series.)—*Répertoire chronologique des littératures modernes, publié par la Commission internationale d'histoire littéraire moderne, sous la direction de Paul van Tieghem*. In progress. Droz, 1935-36. (Pp. 67-131 comprise the seventeenth-century, and give at a glance not only all the most important literary works published in any given year in the chief countries of Europe, but also the events which, directly or indirectly, have affected literature.
